PIE – Rationale for Establishment

- Gaps in data quality, data integration system and standardization
- Gaps in education research to support evidenced-based decision making
- Challenges in responding to the developments in education sector
- Timely reporting against SDG-4,
- Tracking and mainstreaming of Out-of-school children (OOSC)
- Article-25-A deliberations, tracking dropout rates etc.
- Challenges in improved National Achievement Test (Assessments)
- These gaps/challenges demand for a structured Education Data Information Management System, National Assessment and Evidence base Research
- Accordingly, PIE is envisioned to work on education data integration and quality in collaboration with provinces

PIE – Evolution and Functions

Evolution of PIE

- IRC provided recommendations regarding merger of AEPAM & NEAS to form PIE
- PIE has been notified as Executive/Attached Department of MoFE&PT
- ▼ Interim transfer of recurring budget/staff of NEAS/AEPAM in PIE
- Inter-Ministerial consultations are under-way to finalize key functions, structure and HR of PIE
- After endorsement of Establishment and Finance division PIE will be fully functional

Key Functions

- Centre of Excellence to support MoFE&PT for Policy and Plans' formulation
- Central education stats repository for quantitative and qualitative data
- Data analysis on sector plans and global obligations e.g. SDGs
- Act as think tank in education, assessment standards and learning outcomes
- Conduct basic and applied research on various aspects
- Enhance the capacity building of data producers

Functions of NAW

Inform Stakeholders:

About the strengths and weaknesses of the education system (Policy makers, Curriculum developers, Text book writers, Teacher trainers etc.)

Monitor Curriculum Standards:

Students are assessed according to the learning outcomes of the national curriculum and identify strong and weak areas of the students' learning with reference to curriculum.

Identify Correlates of Achievement:

Achievements of the students correlate with the background factors.

Direct Teachers' Efforts and Raise Students' Achievement Level:

To assess the performance of teachers by relating it to the learning achievements of the students.

TIMSS Study 2019 Flashback on SDG-4

- Approximately one-third of children in Pakistan reported having access to preprimary education
- In primary education, approximately 25% of the students achieved minimum proficiency level in mathematics and only approximately 20% in natural sciences
- In terms of Gender Parity, fewer girls had access to school compared to boys (parity index 45/55).
- While boys and girls attained similar performance in mathematics, girls outperform boys in natural sciences. The goal of providing safe, non-violent learning environments can be informed by the fact that near 1 in 5 students reported being bullied every week
- Regarding the supply of qualified teachers, approximately one-third of the students were taught by a teacher who have the minimum required qualification of a bachelor degree (SDG 4.c.1).
- Over 80% of the fourth-graders were taught by teachers who received in-service training in the last two years

Development Objective:

Improve sector coordination and management through building the technical and operational capacity of Federal and Provincial education governments.

The grant focuses on education datasystems' strengthening for improved evidence-based policy and decision making. It includes data standardization and improved student learning assessment systems across the country, as well as building system capacity to use data. Grant total: \$10 million
